MUSIC 2017

Semester 2

Dear Parents,

In Music for semester 2, we are going to be exploring different musical instruments. I am hoping that each child from years 4 to 6 will have the opportunity to learn the basic skills of a tuned instrument and be able to play in a group situation. It can be an instrument they have had some experience on, or an instrument they have never played before. We will be starting this program in Week 1 of Term 3 so hopefully everyone can be organised by then.

For this part of my music program, each child needs access to an instrument. Recorders are easy to find and very cheap at some of the variety stores. Guitars, ukuleles and other woodwind instruments are fine also. Keyboards might be a bit large and awkward but still suitable. If necessary the school does have a limited number of recorders which we are able to lend out on a temporary basis.

Also, if you have any instruments sitting in the garage or the spare room collecting dust, we are trying to increase the supply of instruments in the school and would be very grateful for any donations!

Please make sure the instrument is clearly labelled with your child's name. I also need to make sure that students are aware that the instrument is totally their responsibility. Large instruments can be kept safely in my music room during the day but need to be taken home at the end of the day. **The school holds no responsibility for lost or stolen instruments.**

Term 3 Science with Miss Walmsley

This term all students in Year 1-6 will be studying **Biological Science** and Science Inquiry Skills. The year level topics are outlined below. *Primary Connections* science resources are used in all year levels.

Year 1- Schoolyard Safari

“By observing the features and behaviour of small animals, students glimpse the diversity of animal life. Students explore small animals leading to a better understanding of how their adaptations help them survive in their habitats. Through investigations, students learn how animals move, feed and protect themselves.” Some animals we will investigate include snails and worms from our school garden worm farm.

Year 2- Watch it Grow

“Students will have opportunities to explore the growth of a range of living things and explore the processes of growth and change, of reproduction and death that apply to all animals. Through hands-on activities and investigations, students compare the growth of living things under different conditions.” I am sourcing silkworms, mealworms, butterfly chrysalis’ and/or tadpoles for students to observe over the course of the term.

Year 3- Feathers, fur or leaves?

“Students will explore features of living things, and ways they can be grouped together. Through hands-on activities, students explore how living things can be grouped on the basis of observable features and can be distinguished from non-living things. They use this knowledge to investigate the animal groups in the leaf litter of their own school grounds.” We are hoping to link this learning in with an excursion to Whiteman Park.

Year 4- Plants in Action

“Students' beliefs about flowering plants will be challenged as they work through hands-on activities. Students will develop a sense of wonder and appreciation of plants as they investigate the process of germination, the stages in a plant's life cycle and what plants need for growth.” Students will grow their own bean seed that they can observe and take home at the end of the term.

Year 5- Desert Survivors

“Students will explore some of the physical and behavioural features of desert plants and animals, and to compare them with plants and animals that live in other environments. Through hands-on activities, students investigate how the features of desert plants and animals help them to survive in their own natural environment.” Students will also be asked to complete a homework project this term that will involve researching a particular species of desert plant or animal. They will receive more information regarding this later in the term.

Year 6- Marvellous Micro-organisms

“Students will develop an understanding of the role of micro-organisms in food and medicine. Students investigate the conditions micro-organisms need to grow, learn about yeast and the bread-making process, and research the development of penicillin.” Students will also be very privileged to work alongside a visiting scientist this term. Janessa Pickering is a microbiologist who has partnered with our school through the CSIRO’s Scientists in Schools program.

What is social and emotional learning?

Supporting children's social and emotional development

Babies are born communicators and are capable of experiencing and expressing a wide range of emotions. Through their many positive interactions with caregivers, they learn to feel good about themselves and to enjoy relating with others. They also learn how to manage a range of feelings and to communicate effectively to get their needs met.

As babies grow into toddlers and later preschoolers, they can manage more things by themselves but still need guidance and support from their caregivers. Toddlers want to please adults and also to be themselves. They do this by imitating others and build their self confidence by 'helping' during everyday experiences such as cooking, cleaning, and shopping. They also adapt their behaviour according to their caregivers' responses and are learning ways to cope with conflict and to solve problems through their relationships with significant adults in their lives.

Preschoolers develop their social and emotional skills through a wide network of social relationships including other adults and children.

Supported by their increased language, thinking and planning capabilities, preschoolers are more able to wait for things they want, to negotiate solutions to everyday problems and make decisions for themselves and with others.

Children's social and emotional skills are developing all the time. Skills may develop differently for different children. Children benefit from having many learning and practise opportunities.

Keys to supporting social and emotional skills development

It's important to recognise that social and emotional skills develop over time, and that they may develop differently for different children. Parents and carers and schools working together to help children develop social and emotional skills can really make a positive difference for children's mental health.

Key points

- Talk about feelings - help children explore theirs.
- Be a model - use the skills yourself and show children how they work. Parents and carers don't have to be perfect; showing them you can make a mistake and learn from it can be really helpful too.
- Be a guide - turn difficulties into learning opportunities.
- Acknowledge and appreciate - provide explicit feedback and praise.

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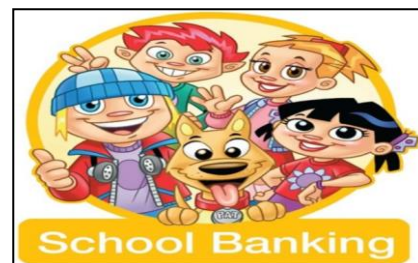
