

Welcome back to the start of a new school year. Out of 19 separate classes between years 1 and 6 we have manufactured only one split class (this not being an issue for teachers). Our numbers have increased considerably (over 30 more students than the corresponding time last year) and they currently sit at 604 with final numbers calculated at the end of next week in preparation for the annual census. A very big welcome to our new teacher on staff in Mr Mark Williams who is placed with one of the year 6 classes.

BEFORE SCHOOL

A gentle reminder to parents that the school instructional day officially commences at 8:45am, even though classes may be open earlier. One of our aims is to encourage positive development of student/personal organisational skills and responsibilities. Whilst we do not wish to discourage parents from enjoying their child's classroom or from making contact with their teacher, we ask parents to drop their children off at the block doors thus allowing them to move independently into their classrooms, where possible. Children can then use this time for some socialisation (an important daily component), organising their bags, preparing for the day by organising their books and general materials, reading their own literature, finishing off work or having some quiet time. Many parents (particularly in the junior years) wish to remain and assist with their child. Whereas this is often welcome, it would be appreciated that parents do not remain in the class after 8:45am. It is to be noted that there are occasions where staff are engaged in collaborative work or have organised meetings with parents prior to the commencement of the instructional day. Again, staff will not be providing formalised or structured learning tasks prior to 8.45am. Students will use this time to settle and prepare for the day ahead. Thank you for your understanding.

CARS AND PARKING

Please be reminded that the traffic around the school will always be a problem and your patience and understanding is requested before and after school. The Kiss-and-Drop is just that. As a matter of courtesy to others, do not park your vehicle in this zone and leave your car unattended. Please use the Kiss-and-Drop as it is intended. Additionally, please do NOT park on neighbours' lawn or property frontage as a matter of courtesy. Further in the Newsletter there is some important information from the City of Joondalup regarding traffic and parking around the school. I urge you to consider the contents. Parking in the Staff Car Park is not permitted.

SAFETY AROUND SCHOOLS - see attachment also

Vehicles which park contrary to parking signage around schools are a major hazard and impact on the safety of children, pedestrians and other road users in these areas. It is imperative that drivers are aware of, and park in accordance with, the parking conditions which apply near schools.

As part of the City's continuing effort to provide a safer environment for everyone City of Joondalup Officers conduct patrols of school parking in the mornings and afternoons throughout the school term.

As part of this initiative Officers use patrol vehicles, which have been fitted with Licence Plate Recognition (LPR) cameras, to capture digital images of vehicles which are parked contrary to parking requirements near schools. Any infringement notices, issued as part of these patrols, will be sent via mail to the registered owner of the vehicle.

Please find attached a copy of the City's School Parking brochure which provides additional information in relation to parking near schools. It would be appreciated if this information could be included in your school newsletters in order to remind parents and caregivers of their responsibility in ensuring that they park correctly near schools.


