SCIENCE WEEK

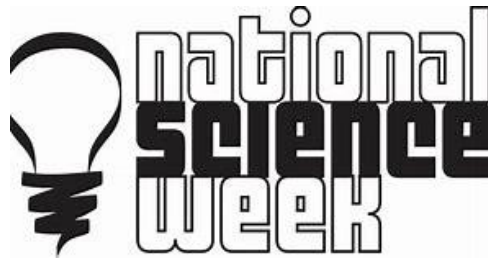
Science week commences just prior to the next Newsletter on Monday 13th August. There are a number of exciting activities planned. Please see below for more information.

somewhere low

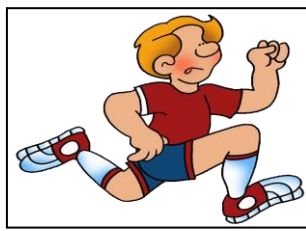

Host a Japanese Student in October

Thanks to the support of the families in our school community we ran a very successful cultural exchange program at Hillary's Primary last October in conjunction with Gold Intercultural Learning. As those families who hosted have already discovered, hosting an international student offers many unique opportunities, including the chance to learn about another culture and build life-long friendships.

Gunma Kokusai Academy will visit us again this year from October 14th through to October 31st. GKA is an English immersion school so students speak and understand English well. These students are in Year Six and are usually eleven years old.

All students in Year Five and Six may apply and will be matched according to gender, and where possible, by age and interests.

Our visitors will accompany host students to their regular classes and interact with them and their friends at recess and lunch.

The family's responsibilities are to involve the student into their routine, including getting them to and from school and to provide breakfast, lunch and dinner. Host families will receive a hosting payment to cover expenses.

A note from the Chair of the School Board:

The Hillarys Primary School Board is made up of 6 parent representatives, 4 staff representatives and our Principal, Ron Chesny. We recently held an election to fill a parent representative vacancy and would like to welcome Kate Day to the school Board.

The Board has a range of functions and in 2018, has ratified the School Business Plan (2018-2020) and continues to evaluate the extent to which the priorities and objectives outlined in the plan are achieved. Receiving financial updates and approving the Contributions and Charges Schedule for 2019 has also been a part of the Board's agenda. Earlier this year, the Board reviewed and updated the School Dress Code, with the newest version available for view on the school's website. Coming up in term 3, a review and update of the Behaviour management and Bullying Policy is scheduled.

Our Community Satisfaction Survey for 2018 is also planned for term 3. Following on from the school vision consultation process, completed in 2017, the survey has a focus of engaging our community and we are seeking to determine how best to generate greater support and investment in our school.
