SUNSMART SUN PROTECTION POLICY 2023 - 2024

Rationale

Protection from the sun is an important public health priority.

Promoting the requirement of wearing of suitable clothing, hats, and applying sunscreen are a school priority.

The school will promote the SunSmart philosophy and will put into practice all possible measures to reduce the exposure of students to the sun while at school.

Hillarys Primary School will:

- Promote the sun protection message to the whole school community via the school website, newsletters, COMPASS, assemblies, whole school activities, parent and staff meetings.
- Provide a copy of this policy in information given to parents when they enrol new students.
- Ensure approved wide-brimmed school hats, protective clothing and sunscreen are worn by staff and students when involved in any outside activities, including swimming.
- Direct students without a hat to remain in areas that are protected from the sun.
- Adopt a 'No hat, no play' policy across all year levels.
- Ensure there is adequate provision of shade within the school grounds and at all sporting carnivals and other events.
- Provide sunscreen in all classes for use by staff and students.
- Encourage parents to supply sunscreen for their children to use at school.
- Deliver SunSmart curriculum to all students.
- Endeavour to limit the exposure of students in outdoor activities in times of high UV periods.
- Review the sun protection policy annually and evaluate SunSmart behaviour of students, staff, parents and visitors and make recommendations for improvement.
- Assess shade provision and usage and make recommendations for increases in shade protection where necessary.
- Update and promote curriculum materials and advertising relevant to SunSmart activities, including annual membership to the SunSmart.

Parents and carers will:

- Ensure their child/ren wear a broad-brimmed hat and protective clothing as required.
- Supply SPF30 or higher broad-spectrum, water-resistant sunscreen and/or
- Support the school's sun protection policy guidelines.

Students will:

- Comply with school and SunSmart rules by wearing appropriate clothing, hats and sunscreen
- Use shaded or covered areas within school where possible.
- Participate in SunSmart education programs.
